Around the classrooms - A weekly round up of what we've been getting up to



This week's certificate winners.

#### <u>Class 1</u>

We are excited to share some delightful activities we have planned for the children, all centred around the story of Little Red, a twist on the tale of 'Little Red Riding Hood.' As part of our exploration of storytelling and creativity, we have been dressing up and acting out different scenes from the story. This imaginative play not only brings the narrative to life but also encourages teamwork, confidence, and communication skills among the children.

As well as the acting, we have also had fun creating our very own 'Blueberry Shake'! This activity allowed the children to engage in sensory play. They explored the process of mixing ingredients,

which links beautifully to our Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) goals, such as understanding the world around us and developing their physical skills.

Next week we will give the children the opportunity to write their own stories inspired by 'Little Blue.' This creative writing exercise will encourage them to express their thoughts and ideas, fostering a love for storytelling and literacy.

We have also been looking at different materials and grouping them together. This is the starting point to our work on building houses for the three little pigs.

We are having fun exploring lots of different fairy tales!





#### <u>Class 2</u>

Class 2 has been sorting materials inside before heading out into the wild and hunting for different objects and discussing their properties in Science. We have used materials in Art too, selecting materials and creating mini collages in preparation for our big one at the end of the half term! Talking of out in the wild, the little Minpins have been predicting what monsters are over the wall, as we venture into the woods for our latest class Literacy book!

We are preparing for more outdoor adventures by sketching our local area and planning some routes in our magical mapping topic in Geography. We've packed out cases and checked in at the *Hotel Flamingo* through our class reader, but things aren't looking too rosy, can the latest new manager (with the help of Class 2) turn things around??

In PSHE we have started to look at how different medicines and household products can be harmful or helpful to make sure we keep safe at home and school. Over in Maths it's all about the money for year 2 who are getting to grips with pounds and pennies in preparation for opening a Class 2 tuck shop! In Year 4 we have been looking at factor pairs and multiplying by 10, 100, 1000.






















### <u>Class 3</u>

Our new topics of learning are posted onto Class Dojo, so we would welcome you discussing with your children what they are learning. (Yes, I remember being a parent to young children- it's always "a little less conversation")- then there are a few prompts there. So in the last few weeks, children have done two Science experiments/investigations (either electricity or energy based), researched Victorian history, written underwater descriptions, learnt piano skills, grappled with fractions, multiplication and division- and that's just off the top of my head. They children have worked very hard and have, on the whole, had a good start to the term- just remind them now and again to keep up with home reading as it is the most important homework- and life skill they can do.
